

- Always respect adults and elders: use proper forms of address, acknowledge the presence of adults, maintain eye-contact.
- Pay attention to the news and announcements.
- If someone does something well in class, we congratulate them. If you do well, do not don't boast/brag. If you lose, do not get upset.
- 4. Always be punctual. It is disrespectful to everyone if you are late.
- Respect everyone. Be empathetic. Put yourself in someone else's shoes.
- When facing a problem with a peer, try to resolve the problem appropriately without hostility. If the problem does not resolve, discuss the problem with the teacher. If you disrupt the class with the problem, both you and the peer will face consequences.
- 7. You should bring your water bottle to class. Leaving the classroom to drink water is prohibited.
- 8. Take care of your personal hygiene: when coughing or sneezing, cover your mouth with your forearm or tissue. If you need to wipe your nose, go to the bathroom. Wash your hands frequently.
- 9. Be polite: always say "please" when asking for something and "thank you" when you receive something.

- Everyone should be responsible with their assignments and supplies.
- Be articulate when speaking, using good pronunciation and appropriate tones. Avoid speaking out of turn: ask permission to speak and wait for others to finish their sentence.

- Use proper etiquette when eating. When someone brings food for everyone, be conscious of how much you take. Remember that others want to try the food as well.

- 18. If you see something wrong, speak up and fix it. Do not wait for others to do it.

- Always be honest regardless of the circumstance. Even if you did something wrong, your honesty means more.

STUDENTS WHO DECIDE TO BREAK A RULE

Minor Violations:

Unexcused tardiness.

Distractions or interruptions.
Instances of disrespect to other members of the

educational staff.
Poor physical appearance of person or uniform.
Intentional messes or vandalization of school property.

Consequences:

- Students will receive two warnings to improve their behavior.
- Upon the third violation, the student will fill out a behavior form.

Consequences:
